September 2025



Humanitarian Situation in September:

- Continued bombardment and killings using various methods and means, including airstrikes, artillery, and explosive-laden robots that wipe out entire residential blocks, in addition to deliberate starvation, have all led to a sharp increase in numbers of martyrs and injuries, including amputations, burns, and permanent disabilities.
- The continued Israeli threat to evacuate various areas of the Gaza Strip, along with the
 increase in forced evacuation orders has confined more than two million Palestinians to an
 area of less than 45 square kilometers. According to OCHA, 88% of Gaza's territory is now
 designated as Israeli military zones or under evacuation orders.
- The crossings have been closed for more than 200 consecutive days (currently operating only partially, with humanitarian aid blocked and entry limited to certain commercial goods). This has forced humanitarian organizations to suspend operations due to lack of suitable conditions, deepening the catastrophe and famine.
- What reaches the Gaza Strip falls far short of minimum needs and is often distributed
 without organization or respect for human dignity. Occupation forces compel aid trucks to
 undergo so-called "self-distribution" which does not guarantee fair distribution of aid amid
 widespread famine and growing basic needs.
- Targeting civilians waiting for aid on their way to or near the so-called distribution centers since 27 May 2025 has resulted in 2,294 martyrs and 16,839 injuries reported in hospitals, in addition to dozens missing, according to the Palestinian Ministry of Health.
- Intensifying hunger and malnutrition among all segments of society due to the systematic starvation policy practiced by the occupation authorities, with an increasing number of deaths reported daily. According to the World Health Organization, 185 deaths due to malnutrition were recorded in August.
- The water crisis (both for domestic use and drinking) continues across all governorates of the Gaza Strip, particularly in Gaza governorate, in particular due to the Israeli occupation's destruction of infrastructure and water networks.
- Airdropped aid poses a threat to civilians' lives and has resulted in the deaths and injuries
 of many. This method also violates humanitarian principles, as the distribution is unfair
 and excludes the most vulnerable and needy groups, in addition to failing to meet the
 massive needs within the Strip.
- Near-total paralysis in various essential sectors, most notably the healthcare sector, which
 is facing total collapse. Many hospitals and clinics have ceased operations due to direct
 destruction, lack of fuel and basic supplies, or being located within evacuation zones.
- Systematic targeting of humanitarian workers, absence of any real protection for them, and obstruction and delay of their humanitarian missions.

Key Events of the PRCS in September:

- On September 2, Disaster Risk Management teams began establishing IDPs center in Deir Al-Balah, in the central Gaza Strip, to help accommodate families displaced from the northern governorates following the onset of military operations there.
- On September 13, the occupation forces issued several evacuation orders IDPs centers in the
 vicinity of Al-Quds Hospital and the administrative headquarters, forcing civilians to flee toward
 the front of the PRCS building. That same day, Tel-Al-Hawa neighborhood witnessed a large
 wave of displacement as a result of the targeting of many residential homes and buildings in
 the area.
- On September 14, the Emergency Operations Room team in the Gaza Strip was forced to relocate from its headquarters in Gaza city to Khan Younis Governorate after the intensified attacks around the office made it increasingly difficult to operate under such complex conditions.
- On September 22, The occupation forces advanced into the streets surrounding Al-Quds Hospital, restricting movement to and from the facility. Since that date, all movements have required prior coordination through the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC).
- On September 22, the electricity generator at Al-Quds Hospital suffered a sudden malfunction, forcing staff to rely on the backup generator for six days, while rationing electricity use and suspending some services, particularly as the occupation refused coordination requests to bring in a replacement generator.
- On September 23, The oxygen generation plant inside Al-Quds Hospital was hit by gunfire during an incursion by the occupation forces around the hospital, causing it to cease operations and forcing reliance on pre-filled oxygen cylinders.
- On September 27, three staff members at Al-Quds Hospital were injured with shrapnel when
 the occupation forces targeted the facility while they were working in the internal pharmacy
 department on the fourth floor. They were transferred for treatment, and their conditions were
 described as minor.
- On September 28, the occupation forces allowed a team from the PRCS to enter Al-Quds
 Hospital to carry out maintenance on the oxygen generation plant and to install a replacement
 electricity generator, after five consecutive days of rejected coordination requests.

Key Events of the PRCS in September:

- During the siege of Al-Quds Hospital, 3 coordination operations were carried out to maintain
 the oxygen generation plant, bring in a replacement generator, and rotate hospital staff. The
 EMS teams also conducted two coordination operations to evacuate 3 patients through Karem
 Abu Salem crossing, while the occupation forces rejected dozens of field coordination requests
 to save the lives of patients and injured in targeted and invaded areas.
- Throughout September, Al-Mawasi Hospital received hundreds of patients and companions weekly in preparation for their evacuation through Karem Abu Salem crossing, in coordination with the World Health Organization (WHO).



Emergency Medical Services

- The teams evacuated (303) martyrs.
- They provided first aid services to approximately (7,266) cases, including injuries from shelling and emergency medical conditions.
- The teams assisted in the medical evacuation of (18) patients and injured in addition to their (18) companions for specialized treatment abroad.










Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene

Affected communities are provided with safe drinking water, access to save and inclusive sanitation facilities and hygiene supplies


- In cooperation with the German Red Cross, PRCS teams distributed approximately 570,000 liters of drinkable water to displaced persons in the Gaza and the Central Governorates.
- The actual daily production of the four water treatment plants in Gaza and Khan Younis reached approximately 80,000 liters of treated water. These plants are unable to function at full capacity due to various logistical and operational constraints (The full capacity production of the 4 is 160,000 liters).





Relief Aid Trucks

- PRCS has not received any relief aid trucks during the reporting period.
- Not receiving any aid trucks since March 2025 has severely impacted PRCS's response operations, due to acute shortage of medical supplies and fuel, and the depletion of food and relief stock.

• To support economically affected families in the West Bank, PRCS, in cooperation with a number of national societies and the IFRC, distributed food parcels across various areas in the West Bank.




